Submission of manuscript

The complete manuscript, prepared in accordance with the **journal's guidelines for authors**, must be submitted in electronic form as a Word document to **Editor (editor@injoedpe.com)**. The manuscript should meet appropriate standards of academic quality and linguistic accuracy. Supporting files should be provided via **e-mail** or **publicly accessible cloud storage service, typically in ZIP or a comparable archive format, with the download link shared with the editorial office by email office@injoedpe.com**. By submitting the manuscript, the author acknowledges and accepts the terms and conditions associated with publication in the journal.

Style and form of the manuscript

Manuscripts should be submitted as a Word document and formatted using **Arial, 12-point** font, with single line spacing, justified text alignment. The use of automatic numbering for sections, figures, tables, references, or similar elements is not permitted. The total length of the manuscript should not exceed **9 000 words** (with abstract, references, incl tables, figures etc.).

Each manuscript must include an abstract written in English, with a recommended length of **250 words**. Authors should also provide **five to six keywords**. The abstract should clearly outline the purpose of the study, the central research question and its approach, the data sources and methods employed (as appropriate to the type of contribution), and the principal findings and conclusions of the paper. References to cited literature or funding and grant support must not be included in the abstract.

Structure of the manuscript

Title Page

- **Authors** (full names, corresponding author *, indicate affiliation with numbers)
- **Affiliation** (department, faculty, university, full address)
- **E-mail** (all authors)
- **Abstract** (max. 250 words)
- **Keywords** (4–6)
- **Highlights** (recommended max. 4 bullet points)
- **ORCID ID**

Recommended structure

1. **Introduction**
2. **Theoretical background**
3. **Data / Methods**
4. **Results / Discussion**
5. **Conclusion**
6. **References**
7. **Acknowledgements**

Figures & Tables

All figures and tables must be mentioned within the text, numbered consecutively, and submitted as separate files. Figures should be provided in **TIFF or PNG** format with a minimum resolution of **300 dpi**. For tables, authors are encouraged to use a clear and easily editable layout (Word document – no figures). Figure captions and table titles should be included within the manuscript and placed directly alongside the corresponding elements, rather than at the end of the article. Each figure and table **must be explicitly referenced** in the main text (e.g., see Fig. 3). Each figure and table must include clear information on content, time frame, and spatial context.

Reference style

Citations in the article should follow the referencing style used by the American Psychological Association. See [*Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, Seventh Edition \(2020\)*](#) ISBN 978-1-4338-3215-4.

The reference list should be arranged alphabetically and then chronologically. More than one reference from the same author(s) in the same year must be identified by the letters 'a', 'b', 'c', etc., placed after the year of publication.

Reference style

Web references

When listing web references, as a minimum you should provide the full URL and the date when the reference was last accessed. Additional information (e.g. DOI, author names, dates or reference to a source publication) should also be provided, if known.

You can list web references separately under a new heading directly after your reference list or include them in your reference list.

Recommendation

- Authors may suggest the names of at least two potential reviewers, including their institutional affiliation and contact email address.
- The editorial office recommends the authors also publish the article in full on the webpages like a Research gate or Academia.edu.
- The editorial office recommends that the manuscript be proofread by a native speaker of English.
- Pages should be numbered at the bottom of the page.
- We encourage you to cite underlying or relevant datasets within article text and to list data references in the reference list. When citing data references, you should include: author name(s), dataset title, data repository, version, year.
